Mr. Jay Rodenbeck:

I, Ashley E. Hartshorn, Project Manager for Archis Design, LLC, do hereby request approval for the alternative landscape plan for Permit BP-2021-07674 at 8310 San Pedro Drive NE. Per Section 14-16-5-6(C)16 of the IDO and Landscape Plan Sheet LS-101, proposed landscaping meet the listed criteria in the following ways:

- 1. Is consistent with the purposes of Section 14-16-5-6 [ref 5-6(C)(16)(a)];
- 2. Does not include invasive vegetation included in a City or State list of prohibited or invasive species or listed as a noxious weed in the City's Weed Identification Handbook [ref 5-6(C)(16)(b)];
- 3. Not only does not reduce, but exceeds tree planting requirements [ref 5-6(C)(16)(c)];
- 4. Exceeds minimum landscape area required: required = 3,750 SF; provided = 6,680 SF;
- 5. Provides superior buffering of adjacent properties from anticipated impacts of the proposed development [ref 5-6(C)(16)(d)] via trees and shrubbery;
- 6. Provides superior visual appearance of the property when viewed from the street [ref 5-6(C)(16)(e)] via trees and shrubbery;
- 7. Provides superior carbon dioxide absorption and heat island reductions [ref 5-6(C)(16)(f)].

Due to our landscape plan meeting or exceeding the above requirements, even with an additional 17' right-of-way already dedicated to the City for the widening of San Pedro, we request alternative approval to not provide parking lot screening in the form of a masonry wall or additional landscape buffer.
