Comment 1: Please clarify if the State of NM Environment Health Department and/or CABQ

Environment Health have reviewed the submittal as a regulatory body.

Response 1: The approvals were obtained by CABQ Environment Health see

approvals letter.

Comment 2: IDO requirement 5-6(C)(5)(e) Organic mulch is required as ground cover under trees

within a 5-foot radius around the tree trunk, but not directly against the trunk is being

met per Landscape General Notes.

Response 2: Ground cover is meeting the requirements of IDO 5-6(C)(5)(e). See

Landscape Detail sheet in the Landscape Planting Specifications section,

Bullet point 4.

Comment 3: Please Note that per IDO 5-6(C)(9) Planting in or over the Public Right-of-way

5-6(C)(9)(a) All planting of vegetated material or installation of any landscaping,

buffering, or screening material in the public right-of-way shall require the prior

approval of the City. The property owner shall be responsible for the maintenance, repairs, or liability for all the landscaping placed in or over the public right-of-way.

Response 3: Noted.

Comment 4:

Per IDO 5-6(C)(14) Irrigation Systems 5-6(C)(14)(a) Irrigation systems shall comply with Section 8 of the ABCWUA Legislation and Ordinances (Cross Connection Prevention and Control Ordinance)

Response 4: The irrigation plan meets the standards. IDO 5-6(C)(14)(a) and ABCWUA Section 8 are met. An approved backflow preventer is proposed at the point of connection.

Comment 5:

Planning staff defers to Parks and Recreation for trails and open space adjacent to an arroyo requirement.

Response 5: Parks and Rec had no further comments.

Note:

1. A landscaping strip was added along 98th street as directed from City Staff. The landscaping strip is within a 15' Public Utility Easement. As a result, trees cannot be planted in this area. Large shrubs, greenery, ground coverage has been provided in the landscape buffer area abutting the front sidewalk area. We have noted that it is more than 30ft from front edge and of course the utility easement.
