Hi Shahab,

Here are my notes from last Friday's meeting of the Broadband Working Group created by Councilor Champine's resolution.

- Michael Velarde with Gigapower joint trenching in good in green fields but is also anticompetitive and will create more delays and more cost
- Catherine Nicolaou asked if there are different sizes of conduit that the companies can use. Michael Velarde answered yes but there are issues associated with using larger conduit.
- Richard Estrade with Ezee Fiber Let's come up with plausible alternatives in the spirit of the rule
- The group talked about overbuilding.
- Vexus/MetroNet said they are willing to go into other areas
- Michael Velarde with Gigapower mentioned how Gigapower has avoided areas that their competitors have gone into

- Vexus/MetroNet mentioned they feel like they've done everything they've been asked to do.
- Richard Estrada with Ezee Fiber suggested that an action item for this meeting should be to get the 3 companies together and create their own working group
- Toni Broberg with Gigapower Gigapower is willing to work with Ezee Fiber and make recommendations
- Dean Serna with Horrocks the City of Albuquerque is well within their authority. Compliance from the companies is needed while minimizing impact to the city.
- City council's last meeting will be June 16th. No meeting in July. This group must have everything ready by August 18th to be present to City Council at September 3rd meeting.
- Second issue the group discussed was the 6 month moratorium.
- Michael Velarde with Gigapower recommended that the city separate residential vs backhaul for conduit sharing. Let the companies construct middle mile w/a moratorium.
- Stacy with Vexus/Metronet brought up a concern. These rules need to be equally applied to Lumen and Comcast.
- Toni Broberg with Gigapower: Shoudn't Lumen and Comcast be held to the same standards?
- Regulation #5: companies expressed concern about a threshold for complaints. Catherine explained that the broadband office separates complaints based on the type of complaint/call/inquiry.
- Kris Smith with Vexus/MetroNet said that they appreciate the spirit of the rules.
- Mark Leech asked the companies, "how do you guys get the word out and educate residents better?" He told them to bring some ideas to the next meeting.
- Michael Velarde with Gigapower suggested that maybe companies can collaborate with NM811.
- Laura, CEO of NM811: Residents want to be heard. She offered the NM811 facility for a town hall Q&A to assist in these efforts. NM811 already educates each caller and helps de-escalate the situation.
- Kris Smith with Vexus/MetroNet: Vexus can offer their PR group and do ride alongs to better educate the community.
- Elaine Romero asked for Kris Smith's contact info.
- Mark Leech recommended that the city tell providers where to dig if there's a conflict.
- Next meeting we will talk about comms and alternatives.
