Dear Mr. Salls:

This letter is to inform you that AMAFCA agrees to allow Salls Brothers Construction to place excess fill dirt from the Costco/Costco Bank Protection Project in the Calabacillas Arroyo from Coors Blvd. to Drop Structure #6 to repair erosion caused by rains from last summer with the following provisions:

- Kurt Wagener, the AMAFCA Field Engineer will direct your crew as to acceptable placement areas.
- Salls will provide moisture control, -2 to +5% of optimum and density control of 90% compaction D-1557 minimum and will provide AMAFCA with testing results.
- No re-vegetation or surveying is anticipated but if it becomes necessary Salls Brothers will provide it at no cost to AMAFCA. Salls will provide AMAFCA with weekly load counts to document the amount of fill placed in the arroyo.
- Salls will be responsible for dust control on all haul roads and fill areas and will crust all surfaces upon completion.
- As the Calabacillas Arroyo is used as open space, Salls will slow equipment down and yield to humans, pets, horses or wildlife whenever encountered.
