


Albuquerque Metropolitan Flood Control






The location of the "Flood Plain Easement" and the wording of the dedication statement, as shown on this plat, is acceptable to AMAFCA.

AMAFCA is the owner of the 30 (thirty) foot wide drainage easement immediately south of the south boundary of this subdivision. This easement was recorded April 27, 1972 in Book Misc. 256, pages 969-973. This easement record and AMAFCA's ownership should be indicated on the plat. The ownership of the fee interest in the easement area should also be indicated on the plat.

AMAFCA has reviewed the Grading and Drainage Plan for this site, as revised 9/28/89. This revised plan incorporates previous comments, by AMAFCA. The revised plan proposes to place a gravel lined channel on AMAFCA's easement. We note that the Grant Line Channel at the south of this property is maintained by the City of Albuquerque. The placement of the gravel lined channel on AMAFCA's easement is acceptable to AMAFCA only if the City of Albuquerque approves of the construction details for the channel and accepts the channel for City maintenance. Written acceptance by the City will be required. AMAFCA would prefer that the drainage be diverted to a single inlet at the property line using on-site drainage swales. If approved by the City of Albuquerque, a second inlet to the Grant Line Channel would also be acceptable to AMAFCA.

If the owner of this subdivision is also the owner of the fee title at the location of AMAFCA's easement, the owner may have rights to construct a privately maintained channel. If this ownership exists, the plat boundary should be revised to include all of the property under a single ownership.

We note that the Grading and Drainage Plan indicates a future access road to connect to Carlisle Boulevard at the south of this subdivision. AMAFCA's easement is for drainage and associated access and does not appear to include the right to grant access for other purposes. Permission from the fee title owner will be required to construct the access. In addition, a license from AMAFCA to cross AMAFCA's easement will also be required.

The Grading and Drainage Plan is approved by AMAFCA subject to the terms and conditions stated herein. Any plan revisions required by the City of Albuquerque, must be resubmitted to AMAFCA for our concurrence. Construction plans should include notification of AMAFCA at least 48 hours in advance of construction on AMAFCA's right of way.
