3. The traffic circulation layout must be stamped, signed, and dated by an engineer or architect licensed in the state of New Mexico.

4. Construction notes and details will need to be provided on any existing and/or proposed infrastructure within Edith frontage, development and parking lot that is applicable to transportation, pedestrian and traffic circulation impacts to site.

- 5. Turning, Vehicle, Template Exhibit:
 - The Truck template size needs to be provided.
 - Your turning truck movement is encroaching onto the adjacent property owner. This will not be allowed. Please adjust your turning template to avoid this encroaching or widen the Edith entrance to accommodate this turning movement.
- 6. How will patrons obtain access to existing parking lot from Edith. Please provide route.

7. Edith Frontage:

- Existing entrance is not ADA current/update and will needed to replaced with new drive
- Edith is classified as a Minor Arterial and as such will need its entrance drive to be curb return with radii's greater than 15 ft per DPM design requirements and new entrance will need to be located with it own property limits without encroaching ont adjacent property frontage limits.

- 18. Motorcycle parking spaces shall be designated by its own conspicuously posted upright sign, either free-standing or wall mounted per the zoning code.Label pavement MC.

- 19. All bicycle racks shall be designed according to the following guidelines:
 - a. The rack shall be a minimum 30 inches tall and 18 inches wide.
 - b. The bicycle frame shall be supported horizontally at two or more places. Comb/toaster racks are not allowed.
 - c. The rack shall be designed to support the bicycle in an upright position. See the IDO for additional information.
 - d. The rack allows varying bicycle frame sizes and styles to be attached.
 - e. The user is not required to lift the bicycle onto the bicycle rack.
 - f. Each bicycle parking space is accessible without moving another bicycle.
- 20. Bicycle racks shall be sturdy and anchored to a concrete pad.
- 21. A 1-foot clear zone around the bicycle parking stall shall be provided.
- 22. Bicycle parking spaces shall be at least 6 feet long and 2 feet wide.

- 25. List radii for all curves shown; for passenger vehicles. Radius for delivery trucks, fire trucks, etc. is 25 ft. or larger.
- 26. Per the DPM, a 6 ft. wide ADA accessible pedestrian pathway is required from the public sidewalk to the building entrances. Please clearly show this pathway and provide details.
- 27. Per DPM, a 6 ft. wide ADA accessible pedestrian pathway is required from the ADA parking stall access aisles to the building entrances. Please clearly show this pathway and provide details.
- 28. ADA accessible pedestrian pathway should not be placed behind parking space or adjacent to a vehicular way. Vehicle and pedestrian/wheel chair conflicts should be avoided as much as possible.
- 29. Curbing should be installed to delineate landscape, parking, and pedestrian ways and identify points of access. Please call out detail and location of barrier curb.
- 30. Parking areas shall have barriers to prevent vehicles from extending over public sidewalk, public right-of-way, or abutting lots.

- 31. Provide a copy of refuse approval.
- 32. Fire Department: An approval Fire 1 plan needs to be provided.
- 33. It is not apparent what type of pavement surface is being proposed. A hard driving surface will be required as part of this proposed project for parking area and drive aisles.
- 34. Please provide a sight distance exhibit
- 35. Show the clear sight triangle and add the following note to the plan: "Landscaping and signage will not interfere with clear sight requirements. Therefore, signs, walls, trees, and shrubbery between 3 and 8 feet tall (as measured from the gutter pan) will not be acceptable in the clear sight triangle.

Other Notes

- 36. Please specify the City Standard Drawing Number when applicable.
- 37. Shared Site access: driveways that straddle property lines, or are entirely on one propertybut are to be used by another property, shall have an access easement. Please include a copy of your shared access agreement with the adjacent property owner.
- 38. Add a note stating "All broken or cracked sidewalk must be replaced with sidewalk and curb & gutter." A build note must be provided referring to the appropriate City Standard drawing (2430 & 2415A).
- 39. Please provide a letter of response for all comments given.
