Re: Storm Water Drainage Problem

Dear Mr. Stone

This is to advise you that the storm water drainage from your building lot at the subject address is illegally tied-in to the sanitary sewer system. This is in violation of our sewer use ordinance specifically part (!) of Section I which states, "No person shall discharge or cause to be discharged any storm water, surface water, ground water, roof runoff, or subsurface drainage to any sanitary sewer." A sanitary sewer is defined as follows, "Sanitary Sewer shall mean the public sewer portion of the wastewater treatment works and to which storm, surface and ground water are not intentionally admitted."

Recently our field crews "smoke and dye tested" the public sewer system in response to a citizen complaint and the work revealed that the lot drainage is tied into your sanitary service line within your property with the service line connected to our sewer on San Pedro.

We have reviewed the approved drainage plan with personnel from the Municipal Development Department and find that the plan calls for an on-site drainage system. This is the only alternative which could have been approved by the City since a storm sewer system is not available in this area. The plan we are referring to was prepared by Enchantment Engineering and is dated October 9, 1978. We are told that at one time such a system was installed but later the area was paved over and a pump and force main system installed.

Please appreciate that storm water tied into a sanitary system causes unnecessary treatment costs and also will overload a sanitary sewer. The line on San Pedro is only an 8-inch line and thus excessive load places the system in a dangerous situation in that public and private damage may occur due to a sewer backup.

Please be advised that you must correct the situation within thirty days from receipt of this letter or show cause as to why you cannot correct the matter.

We trust you understand our position in this matter. We will be happy to meet with you or your engineering representative if you need additional information.
